Port of Kingston Appoints New Commissioner

The Port of Kingston Commission voted unanimously to appoint District 1, Port of Kingston resident Steve Heacock to the vacant position left open after Bruce MacIntyre's resignation earlier this year.

Heacock, a long time Kingston resident, has been involved in the community and served on the Kingston Citizens Advisory Council for 20 years. "He gets our community," said Commissioner Chair, Mary McClure. "His vision and the relationships he has forged over the years will give him the insights necessary to be a very good Commissioner."

"This was a very difficult decision because both of our candidates brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to the position," said Commissioner Laura Gronnvoll.

Commissioner Heacock will serve out the term of Bruce MacIntyre, which will end in December of 2019.
