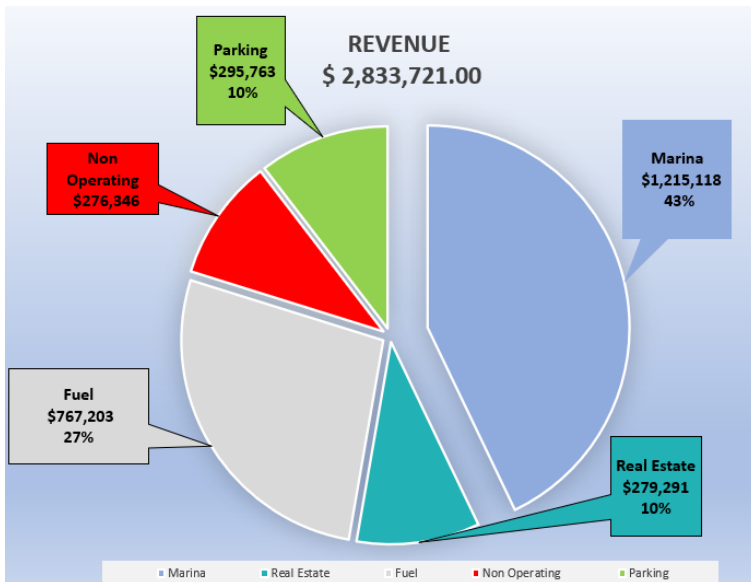
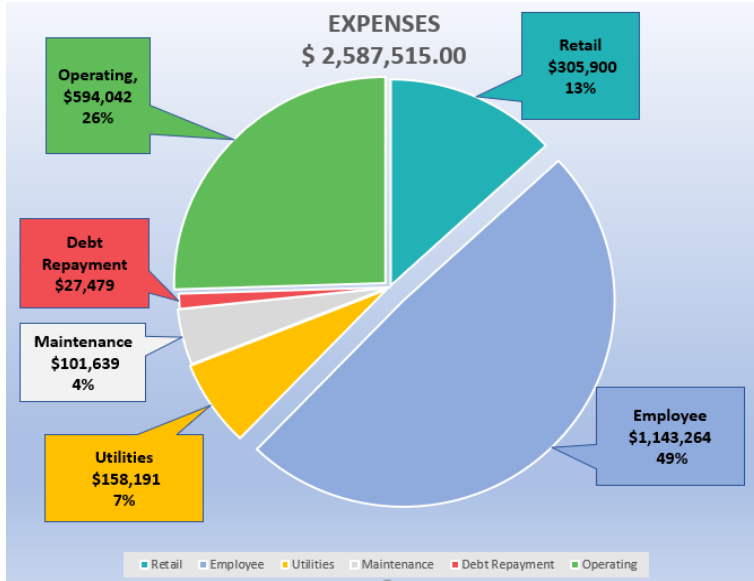

SR104 Ferry Holding Lanes & Active Traffic Management System (ATMS)



Partner Agencies that include Kitsap County, Port of Kingston and WSDOT, Kitsap Transit, and WSF are working to develop potential solutions to improve

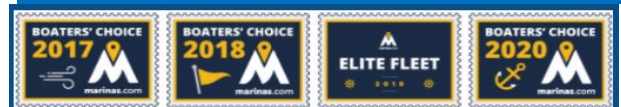
traffic flow in Kingston and allow for downtown enhancements. The Kingston-Edmonds ferry route handles the second highest annual volume of vehicles and drivers (over 4 million riders). During peak and near-peak periods, the on-dock ferry terminal holding area experiences processing delays without notice and fills to maximum capacity. Washington State Ferry traffic queues on SR 104 through Kingston, creating unsafe conditions, congestion, and blocks movement within Kingston. This study identifies proposed solutions to address and improve traffic conditions.

2021 GRANT UPDATES

Transient Moorage Floats and the Guest Restroom were identified as needs in the Port Capital Improvement Plan. These projects were combined for the purposes of applying for grants through the WA state Recreation and Conservation Office. The Port has been awarded funding for the following:
