Is Your Boat Ready for Fall & Winter?

The rain will happen, it is inevitable. Damp cold air is hard to combat in the PNW. Below are some best practices regarding heaters and boat cabins.

Heating your boat's cabin with one or more electric space heaters may run against the limitations of a 30-amp shore power connection.

This is a good way to trip your shore power breaker, or to cause an onboard fire. The typical 120-volt AC space heater has two or more settings, with the "High" setting usually 1,500 watts. This heater will draw about 14 amps. Plug in a pair, running on the highest setting, and you're drawing 28 amps. Then when your battery charger automatically cycles on, you'll trip the main breaker for sure. There are several types of space heaters designed for boat cabins and engine spaces. They cycle on and off in temperatures between approximately 40°F and 55°F and are safer than home space heaters or a constantly burning 60W light bulb. Engine block heaters work best when you place covers over your boat's bilge blower vents. This will keep the cold, damp winter wind out of the engine compartment and keep the heat on.

- Replace any shore power components that are damaged, check both ends of shore power cord for burn marks or melted insulation.
- Report damaged dockside receptacles to the Marina office.

Fall and Winter brings windy conditions. Stay ahead of weather-related issues.

- Check mooring lines, adjust, or replace as needed
- Check boat canvas is secure and will drain rainwater
- Flush deck scuppers, flybridge & hatch combing drains. Clear debris from drain tubes
- Ensure auto bilge pump operates and discharges overboard
- Keep dinghy secure and empty, no fuel containers that will float
