This unique event is 100+ boats cruising 100 nautical miles-the full length of Puget Sound-from Olympia to Port Townsend, WA. It is not your typical sailing regatta with sleek, high-performance yachts racing in a highly competitive environment. Instead, it is a gathering of small-boat enthusiasts who come together to share their love for traditional sailing and rowing vessels. The fleet comprises an impressive array of boats, including SCAMPs, Whitehalls, wherries, sharpies, melonseeds, and flatiron skiffs. Among them are smaller production sailboats and dozens of home-built creations, showcasing the ingenuity and passion of their owners.
