A couple of basic Winterizing items to consider Boat or RV

Drain fresh water system, add propylene glycol (non-toxic) to avoid frozen plumbing. Combining portable heaters with a dehumidifier is the best way to keep mold and mildew at bay, whether you live on your boat/RV or close it up for winter. A dehumidifier will need to drain into a sink with an open drain or into sump with an automatic discharge pump. A shower drain / sump works well. Draining to a shower sump will keep the water out of the bilge and avoid unwanted fluids from discharging overboard. Remove bedding & empty closets, fabric holds moisture and molds quickly. Space heaters must have a grounded plug and tip-over protection. Please call my cell number if there are questions regarding preferred methods for winterization.
